Rotary has been very busy recently. We sponsored an informational night at the Information Center open to the public for the purpose of providing information about Rotary. After the group toured a number of display boards showing pictures and articles about KF projects, Mayor Dorothy Slagle read a proclamation making February 23 Official Rotary Club Day in Kettle Falls. The plaque is framed and under glass and will be hanging from the club's meeting room wall at Sandy's Restaurant.

We purchased "the green bench" for \$350.00, donated it to the Information Center and purchased a plaque that will read, "Donated by KF Rotary". The bench dates back to the old Kettle Falls Train Depot where it spent many years gracing the main room of the depot.

Project Graduation requested funding and we voted to donate \$200.00 toward their grad night expenses.

The Kettle Falls Historical Society asked for monies to help fund their 13th annual Student Art Contest for Middle School and High School ages. It was moved and seconded to give them \$100.00.

We purchased a new dishwasher and donated it to the KF Senior Citizens.

We completed our annual Bingo Session, which ran for twelve consecutive Wednesdays. We have split the proceeds between the KF Teen Center and the Town and Country Days 3-on-3 basketball tournament. They plan to purchase new lifetime-guaranteed outdoor basketball hoops.

We have appointed a committee to prepare application papers for the \$1,000.00 WDFI scholarship that is given to an alcohol and drug free student at KF High. This is the third year that this scholarship has been offered. It is funded three ways: Harvest Foods contributes \$250.00, Columbia Navigation gives \$250.00 and Rotary matches those amounts.

Upcoming projects include our second Litter Patrol Day, the designing, building and decorating of our float entry in the Town and Country Days parade, and our Drive to help eradicate polio from the face of the earth. Only four countries still have polio and those funds will be ear-marked for the countries. This is our answer to the question, "How do you protect Kettle Falls kids from polio?" And the answer is, by eradicating the disease from the world. Then, and only then, can all children in the world be safe from such a cruel disease.
