## FIREWORKS

A few reminders to people who want to set off fireworks in the city limits. The only legal fireworks are the "Safe and Sane" type that are sold at local stands. A lot of the fireworks sold out of state or on Reservations are not legal in Washington. Firecrackers, chasers, bottle rockets and missiles are some of the common illegal fireworks that people set off. M-80's, cherry bombs and such are considered illegal explosive devices, and people in possession of these items are subject to arrest. If you have a question of whether your fireworks are legal or not, contact someone at the Police Department to answer your question. Also, fireworks can only be discharged between the following times:

June 28th 12:00 noon to 11:00 p.m.

June 29th-July 3rd 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.

July 4th 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight

July 5th 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.

We urge everyone discharging fireworks to have fun, but be safe and watch for fire dangers.

Never discharge fireworks at a person, or toward your neighbor's property.
