There isn't much going on with the Kettle Falls Community Chest this month. The fundraisers from March, April and May are all over and the counts are in for all but the May drive at AmericanWest Bank.

The Feinstein Challenge for March and April was a bigger success than anticipated. For 2010, 1694 pounds of food and \$3,544.36 was donated, making the total \$5,238.36. Last year's total was \$5,864.15. Special thanks to Connie Carver and Studio 395 for their efforts and continual help each year with this challenge. They brought in 390 pounds of food and \$131.00 to this effort. Thanks to the local churches who make this their yearly focus, and to all the individuals who donated money and did special shopping trips to help out the less fortunate in our community.

At printing time for this paper, results weren't available for either the AmericanWest Success by Six food drive, or the final results of the Mother's Day plant sale. I'm happy to report that many people stopped by our sale the day before Mother's Day to discuss gardening with our experts in attendance. We would like to thank all who donated garden plants and house plants.
